BOARD MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 5:20 p.m.

I. Announcement of Compliance

Mrs. Barz read the following statement:

It is hereby announced and recorded that the requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act as to proper notification of time and place of meeting have been satisfied.

The Open Public Meetings Act, or Sunshine Law, requires that the Board notify the public of impending meetings, and that it conduct those meetings in public. It does not require participation in those meetings.

The Board has published procedures to offer members of the public and members of the campus community opportunities to address issues relevant to the Board's powers and duties. Requests to speak to the agenda items must be registered at least 24 hours in advance of the meeting. Request to speak to other items relevant to the Board's powers and duties must be submitted in writing one week prior to the Board meeting, and should specify in detail the nature of the topic and comments. Forms to register are available in the Office of the President. These procedures are designed to encourage the orderly conduct of the Board's business, to support duly established College relationships, and to ensure that thoughtful discourse characterizes the Board's deliberation.

Comments from persons registered to speak are limited to a reasonable length of time. Members of the public may not make motions. The Board may choose, after hearing a comment, to refer the issue to committee, to refrain from action entirely, or to defer discussion to a more appropriate time.

Mrs. Barz announced that one person had registered to speak. It was also noted that one other person had requested to speak.

II. Pledge of Allegiance

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The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

III. Swearing In of New Trustee

Mr. William Kane was sworn in by Judge Charles Delehey, N.J. Superior Court, and welcomed by Mrs. Barz.

Mr. Joseph Ellis welcomed the new trustee.

IV. Approval of the Minutes of the December 15, 1992 Public Board Meeting

It was moved by Dr. Kibler, seconded by Ms. Horne, that the minutes be approved. The motion carried unanimously.

V. Report of the President

The President made his report. Among his comments was a welcome to the new public member of the Board of Trustees, and an acknowledgment of Dr. Marcus, who is now the Chancellor's representative to the Board.

VI. Report of the Nominating Committee

Dr. Enriquez reported for the Nominating Committee. On behalf of the Committee, he nominated Eleanor Horne as Vice Chair of the Board, to fill an unexpired term ending September 1993. Dr. Kibler seconded the nomination, and following comments, the motion passed unanimously.

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RESOLUTION CONCERNING TRENTON STATE COLLEGE'S FISCAL YEAR 1993 TUITION

Whereas:

Trenton State College sustained significant reductions in state support in Fiscal Year 1991 and Fiscal Year 1992 and absorbed that underfunding through a program review that resulted in an eight percent reduction in full time staff and in significant reductions in essential non-salary expenditures in computing, library acquisition and maintenance projects; and

Whereas:

The Legislature reduced the Governor's Fiscal Year 1993 Recommended Budget for Trenton State College by \$3.8 million; and

Whereas:

The Fiscal Year 1993 underfunding, when combined with the Fiscal Year 1991 and Fiscal Year 1992 reductions, threatened to seriously undermine the quality of the education at Trenton State College; and

Whereas:

In response to the continued underfunding of Trenton State College and in recognition of the impact of that underfunding both on Fiscal Year 1993 and Fiscal Year 1994, on July 2, 1992, the Trenton State College Board of Trustees approved a schedule of tuition and fees, including a \$500 "Fee for Quality," that ensured the continued delivery of a quality education to Trenton State College students; and

Whereas:

On September 10, 1992, the Trenton State College Board of Trustees, in order to be consistent with the opinion of the Attorney General that the \$500 "Fee for Quality" approved as part of the schedule for tuition and fees on July 2, 1992 was "akin to tuition," acted to forgo participation in the Tuition Stabilization Incentive Grant program and to declare the "Fee for Quality" as tuition, thereby forfeiting \$1.1 million in TSIG funds; and

Whereas:

The Budget Committee of the Board of Higher Education subsequently asked the College for information on this action by the Trenton State College Board of Trustees; and

Whereas:

Trenton State College has complied with the requests for information and has engaged in discussions with the Department of Higher Education in an effort to help the Department understand the College's financial needs; and

Whereas:

The Department of Higher Education in discussions with members of the College administration has urged a reduction in the \$500 tuition increase; and

Whereas:

The Budget and Finance Committee of the Trenton State College Board of Trustees has carefully reviewed the College's Fiscal Year 1993 financial position and has advised the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees that the College's fiscal soundness for Fiscal Year 1994 can best be served by taking no further action at this point on the Fiscal Year 1993 tuition; and

Whereas:

The Executive Committee of the Trenton State College Board of Trustees has reviewed its September recommendation to change the \$500 "Fee for Quality" to a \$500 tuition increase

Therefore Let It Be Resolved:

That the Board of Trustees of Trenton State College reaffirms its decisions of September 10, 1992 to address a two year (Fiscal Year 1993 and Fiscal Year 1994) budget problem by forgoing participation in the Tuition Stabilization Incentive Grant program and declaring the \$500 increase in charges for Fiscal Year 1993 to be tuition; and

Be It Further Resolved:

That in light of the Fiscal 1994 budget uncertainties, the Trenton State College Board of Trustees has concluded that it would not be fiscally prudent to take any action at this point that would further reduce the current and future resources of the College, and, therefore, will defer consideration of any changes in the Fiscal Year 1993 tuition level until such time as the College's Fiscal Year 1994 appropriation is decided.
