The Board of Trustees on April 25, 1996 approved the major construction project, entitled Armstrong Parking Garage, at a total project cost of \$1,600,000 and authorized the President to advance this project, the funding for and construction thereof; and

WHEREAS:

The College has advertised for bids on two occasions, June 2, 1996 and July 14, 1996, and has rejected bids on two occasions because the College determined that they are not reasonable as to price, on the basis of cost estimates prepared for the College prior to advertising, and on one occasion no bids were received for the prime contract for general/site work; and

WHEREAS:

Pursuant to the 1986 State Colleges Contract Law, Section 18A:64-56, any contract or agreement may be authorized by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the authorized membership of the board of trustees authorizing the contract or agreement when the aforementioned circumstances have occurred, provided that the terms, conditions, and restrictions and specifications set forth in the negotiated contract or agreement are not substantially different from those which were the subject of competitive bidding; and, now therefore, be it

RESOLVED:

That the Board of Trustees of The College of New Jersey hereby authorizes the negotiation of the contracts for the Armstrong Parking Garage project, at a total cost of less than \$1,376,000.

SUBJECT: Resolution Authorizing the Negotiation of Six Contracts

Associated with the Armstrong Parking Garage Project

In their April 25, 1996 meeting, The College of New Jersey Board of Trustees approved a resolution which authorized the major construction project, entitled Armstrong Parking Garage, at a total project cost of \$1,600,000. The resolution was the result of the College's determination that the elimination of the underground parking in the Science Complex Project and the elimination of Parking Lot 13 necessitated the construction of a new 147 vehicle parking garage over the existing Lot 13A, behind Armstrong Hall.

Accordingly, the College's project manager, Design Interface, had detailed construction drawings and specifications prepared and estimated the construction cost to be \$1,125,000. The project was then publicly advertised in the beginning of June, 1996 with the request for bids from general/site work, precast concrete, masonry, miscellaneous metals, electrical, and mechanical contractors. Of the sixteen bids received and opened on July 1, 1996, the lowest responsive bids from each of the six prime contractors or trades totaled \$1,556,834, which was \$431,834 in excess of the construction cost estimate of \$1,125,000. The lowest responsive bid received from the single general contractors was in the amount of \$1,552,000, which was \$427,000 in excess of the construction cost estimate. The College therefore determined that it was necessary to re-advertise the project and requested that Design Interface make a concerted effort to attract additional contractors in an effort to increase the number of respondents to the project.

The project was publicly advertised for the second time in mid-July, 1996 with Design Interface contacting 144 firms in an attempt to increase the number of respondents.

Of the twelve bids received and publicly opened on August 6, 1996, the lowest responsive bids from five of the six prime contractors or trades totaled \$644,395, with no responses received for the site work portion of the project. Four of the five trades submitted low bids that were in excess of the construction cost estimate for these trades. Thus, the College was not in a position to award these contracts following a multiple prime method. The lowest responsive bid received from the single general contractors was in the amount of \$1,376,000, which was \$251,000 in excess of the construction cost estimate. Again, the College was not in a position to award a single contract to a general contractor. Design Interface expressed confidence that the construction cost estimate was accurate and that the bids did not reflect the true nature and cost of this project.

Since the College was committed to the advancement of the Armstrong Parking Garage Project and had confidence in Design Interface, I proceeded to offer to those contractors responding to the second advertised bid the opportunity to negotiate a contract, based upon the terms, conditions, specifications, and drawings of the aforementioned bids. pursuant to the provisions of the 1986 State College Contracts Law, Section 18A:64-56. I accomplished this, pursuant to this provision of our procurement statute, which provides the College with the ability to negotiate a contract when "the State college has advertised for bids pursuant to section 4 of this article on two occasions and (i) has received no bids on both occasions in response to its advertisement, or (ii) has rejected the bids on two occasions because the State college determined that they are not reasonable as to price, on the basis of cost estimates prepared for or by the State college prior to advertising therefor, ...., or (iii) on one occasion no bids were received pursuant to (i) and on one occasion all bids were rejected pursuant to (ii), in whatever sequence; any contract or agreement may then be negotiated by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the authorized membership of the board of trustees authorizing the contract or agreement: provided that: (1).... (2) The terms, conditions, restrictions and specifications set forth in the negotiated contract or agreement are not substantially different from those which were the subject of competitive bidding pursuant to section 4 of this article; and (3) Any minor amendment or modification of any of the terms, conditions, restrictions and specifications, which were the subject of competitive bidding pursuant to section 4 of this act, shall be stated in the resolution awarding the contract or agreement; except that if on the second occasion the bids received are rejected as to price, the State college shall notify each responsible bidder, submitting bids on the second occasion of its intention to negotiate and afford each bidder a reasonable opportunity to negotiate, but the State college shall not award the contract or agreement unless the negotiated price is lower than the lowest rejected bid price submitted on the second occasion by a responsible bidder, is the lowest negotiated

price offered by any other reasonable vendor, and is a reasonable price for the work, materials, supplies or services."

Thus, I recommend The College of New Jersey Board of Trustees consider approval of a resolution that authorizes the negotiation of the contracts for the Armstrong Parking Garage project, following the same terms, conditions and scope as was bid on in August, 1996 at a total cost less than \$1,376,000.

Following the Board of Trustees approval of this recommended resolution, contracts would be awarded, pursuant to the above described negotiations, totaling \$1,131,600, which is less than the previously bid total of \$1,376,000. Further, it should be noted that all of these contracts would either be less than or at the cost of the lowest received bids, that to the best of my knowledge these prices are the lowest offered by other reasonable vendors and that these costs are reasonable for this work.
