Requests to speak to the agenda items must be registered at least 24 hours in advance of the meeting. Request to speak to other items relevant to the Board's powers and duties must be submitted in writing one week prior to the Board meeting, and should specify in detail the nature of the topic and comments. Forms to register are available in the Office of the President. These procedures are designed to encourage the orderly conduct of the Board's business, to support duly established College relationships, and to ensure that thoughtful discourse characterizes the Board's deliberation.

Comments from persons registered to speak are limited to a reasonable length of time. Members of the public may not make motions. The Board may choose, after hearing a comment, to refer the issue to committee, to refrain from action entirely, or to defer discussion to a more appropriate time.
