Resolution Approving Rates for 2022-2023 Course Fee for Perioperative Nursing Practice

Whereas: The State College Autonomy Law vests the responsibility with the Board

of Trustees to approve and adjust student charges as necessary; and

Whereas: The College of New Jersey plans to offer a new course in perioperative

nursing practice during the 2022-2023 academic year, which may include

winter and summer sessions; and

Whereas: This new course for perioperative nursing practice is designed to meet the

growing shortage of operating room nurses. It is designed for both

undergraduate nursing students and experienced Registered Nurses (RNs)

who desire to work in the operating room; and

Whereas: The didactic materials for the course are aligned with the Association of

Operating Room Nurses (AORN) standards and designed to support highquality learning and application of knowledge in the clinical area. The AORN course materials are purchased instead of a textbook; these provide

the foundation for taking the national AORN certification exam,

certification desired by employers. AORN is the only recognized source for these materials. These materials are considered the gold standard for perioperative nursing preparation. The cost of these materials is \$995; and

Whereas: To facilitate potential financial aid support for students enrolled, the \$995

costs for the course materials will be added to the charges for the

perioperative nursing practice course; and

Whereas: The Dean of the School of Nursing and Health Sciences and the Provost

and Vice President for Academic Affairs each recommend this fee of \$995

per student; and

Whereas: The President has reviewed the dean's and provost's recommendation and

provides her recommendation thereof.

The College of New Jersey Board of Trustees Resolution Approving Audited Fiscal Year 2022 Financial Statements Subject to Final Approval of the Audit, Risk Management and Compliance Committee

WHEREAS The Board of Trustees is authorized by statute (N.J.S.A. 18A:64-1 et

seq.) and the By-laws (Section 2.r) to have prepared an annual

independent financial audit of the College; and

WHEREAS Pursuant to resolution of the Board of Trustees at its April 29, 2020

meeting, the College engaged the independent audit firm KPMG LLP to perform an independent audit of the College's financial statements for

fiscal years 2020, 2021 and 2022; and

WHEREAS KPMG LLP has conducted its audit of the College's financial statements

for fiscal year 2022 (the "Draft 2022 Financial Statements"), which do not include other post-employment benefits ("OPEB") information (the "OPEB Information"), yet to be supplied by the State of New Jersey, that is required to be reported in accordance with Government Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 75 - "Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions" ("GASB

75"); and

WHEREAS The State of New Jersey is expected to complete and submit to the

College the OPEB Information to be included on the College's final fiscal year 2022 audited financial statements (the "Final 2022 Financial

Statements") in December 2022 or spring 2023; and

WHEREAS Upon receiving the OPEB Information, KPMG LLP has committed to

complete and submit to the College the Final 2022 Financial

Statements; and

WHEREAS KPMG LLP has confirmed that the State is legally obligated to pay the

OPEB benefit coverage for eligible retirees of the College under N.J.S.A.52:14-17.32, and that because the College does not contribute directly to the Plan, there is no total OPEB liability, deferred outflows of resources or deferred inflows of resources to report in the College's

financial statements; and

WHEREAS Management and KPMG LLP presented the Draft 2022 Financial

Statements for fiscal year 2022 to the Audit, Risk Management and Compliance Committee (the "Committee") at a meeting of the Committee held on November 15, 2022 during which, following best

practices, the Committee met privately with KPMG LLP; and

WHEREAS

Management has committed to present the Final 2022 Financial Statements to the Committee upon receiving them from KPMG LLP; and

WHEREAS

The Committee has reviewed and duly considered the Draft 2022 Financial Statements and the Committee has recommended conditional approval of the Final 2022 Financial Statements by the Board, subject to: (i) the Committee's confirmation after this date that there is no material adverse change in the Final 2022 Financial Statements from the Draft 2022 Financial Statements, and (ii) the Committee's approval of the Final 2022 Financial Statements; and

WHEREAS

Copies of the College's audited financial statements for fiscal year 2022 that have been approved by the Board of Trustees are required to be submitted to the State Treasurer;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:
