levels and adjust student charges as necessary; and
- Whereas:The College recognizes a standard full fall or spring semester
course load at four course units (equivalent to 16 credit hours),
which course load may be adjusted by a school depending on
curricular requirements (the "Full Course Load"); and
- Whereas:For years, TCNJ has provided a flat tuition rate for three (3) or
more course units per semester; and
- Whereas:Many New Jersey colleges and universities charge a flat rate for
a fixed number of courses or credit hours, and credits or courses
taken above that number are charged on an incremental basis;

- Whereas: After careful study, the administration has recommended the adoption of a tuition package pricing model that provides for a flat full-time semester tuition rate with the addition of incremental pricing for the number of course units taken by a student in an academic year that exceed the Full Course Load by more than one course (the "Tuition Package Pricing Model"); and
- Whereas:Changes in students' enrollment behavior resulting from
implementation of the Tuition Package Pricing Model may lead
to an improvement in on-time graduation, academic resiliency,
student mental health, course scheduling and academic support
services; lower costs of instruction; and potential incremental
tuition revenue; and
- Whereas:The Business and Infrastructure Committee of the Board of
Trustees has reviewed the Tuition Package Pricing Model and
