The Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs recommends to the President a 15% graduate tuition discount for students taking classes as part of a structured cohort, defined as a group of students from an organization that matriculate into and move through a program together, typically taking the same courses in a predetermined sequence.

The President has reviewed the 15% discount for cohort members and recommends approval thereof.
