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**Resolution Approving Rates  
for 2025-2026 Graduate Transcription Fee**

- Whereas: The State College Autonomy Law vests the responsibility with the Board of Trustees to approve and adjust student charges as necessary; and
- Whereas: As outlined by the American Council on Education, The College of New Jersey acknowledges the benefits of offering credit for prior learning as a means of recognizing the college-level knowledge that adult learners gain outside of the traditional college classroom and making higher education accessible to a wider range of learners.
- Whereas: The Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs recommends to the President a transcription fee range of \$100 to \$500 per graduate credit for qualified candidates who complete coursework or qualifying examinations that have been approved through appropriate TCNJ governance processes as offering a learning experience equivalent to specific graduate-level coursework.
- Whereas: The President has reviewed the \$100 to \$500 per-credit transcription fee and recommends approval thereof.

**Resolution Approving Rates  
for 2025-2026 Cohort Programs Discount**

Whereas: The State College Autonomy Law vests the responsibility with the Board of Trustees to approve and adjust student charges as necessary; and

Whereas: As part of TCNJ's long-term vision and recruitment efforts, the College seeks to enhance the educational experience by providing a discount for students progressing through programs as a cohort. Students in a cohort benefit from sharing academic and professional experiences, often fostering a sense of community and collaboration. This initiative aims to support student success, foster collaboration, and strengthen relationships with governmental, non-profit, and corporate partners, while ensuring that students benefit from a more affordable and cohesive learning journey.

Whereas: The Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs recommends to the President a 15% graduate tuition discount for students taking classes as part of a structured cohort, defined as a group of students from an organization that matriculate into and move through a program together, typically taking the same courses in a predetermined sequence.

Whereas: The President has reviewed the 15% discount for cohort members and recommends approval thereof.

For the purposes of this report, The College of New Jersey is following the Clery Act and VAWA definitions for reporting crime statistics.
