# The College of New Jersey Board of Trustees Resolution Authorizing the President or His Designee to Execute the Third Amendment to the Ground Lease Between The College of New Jersey and PRC Campus Centers, LLC

Whereas: The Board of Trustees previously authorized The College of New Jersey's

(TCNJ or the College) participation in a Public-Private Partnership with PRC Campus Centers, LLC (PRC), in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:64-85 *et seq.*, the terms and provisions of which were incorporated into a Ground Lease, dated April 4, 2014, and which established a mixed-use development

on College property called "Campus Town"; and

Whereas: On December 19, 2014, the Board of Trustees authorized TCNJ to enter

into Amendment No. 1 to the Ground Lease, which, among other things, authorized the construction of two residential buildings in addition to those authorized under the Ground Lease and provided for PRC's construction

and funding of maintenance of a new formal entrance for the College; and

Whereas: On April 26, 2016, the Board of Trustees authorized TCNJ to enter into

Amendment No. 2 to the Ground Lease, which provided for conveyance of title to a portion of the leased property and an easement to the New Jersey

Department of Transportation; and

Whereas: TCNJ and PRC have determined that further amendment to the Ground

Lease is desirable to achieve the aims of the parties and to secure the long

term viability and success of the Campus Town Development; and

Whereas: TCNJ and PRC have negotiated the following terms to be memorialized in

a formal amendment to the Ground Lease: (1) a 25-year extension of the term of the Ground Lease, which will now terminate on July 1, 2091; (2) lifting of the restriction on leasing residential spaces to underclass students, including up to 96 first-year students, with payment by PRC to TCNJ of \$1,500 per first-year student; (3) lifting of restriction on certain office and medical use in retail portion of Campus Town; (4) lifting of limitation on TCNJ's right to operate a bookstore/spirit shop on campus; (5) a \$300,000 rent credit to PRC over a one-year period; (6) suspension of annual rent increases from September 2026 to August 2034; and (7) beginning September 2034, adjustment of the annual rent increase from a \$25,000 annual increase to a percentage rate increase based on the Consumer Price

Index.

Therefore, Be It

**Resolved:** That The College of New Jersey Board of Trustees hereby approves the

terms of the proposed Third Amendment to Ground Lease between TCNJ

and PRC.

That the President and other appropriate officers of the College are authorized to take such actions, prepare such documents and amendments, and affix their signatures on behalf of the College to such documents and amendments, all as may in their judgment be necessary or desirable to accomplish the purposes of this resolution.

# Faculty/Librarian Representation to the Board of Trustees

# I. INTRODUCTION

This is the policy on faculty/librarian representation to the Board. The Board reaffirms the importance of faculty/librarian representation to the Board to assist it in its decision-making. Therefore, the College will continue to have two elected faculty/librarian representatives to the Board.

  - Focus on the faculty's primary responsibilities: curriculum, methods of instruction, course content, research, faculty status, the quality of student life as it pertain to academic programs and progress, and for student outcomes (As set out in "Collegial Governance at Trenton State College," May 17, 1989).
  - ii. Advise and comment on the faculty's involvement in implementing the mission of the College.
  - iii. Participate in public Board meetings and in the committees to which they are assigned full rights and responsibilities of discussion.
  - iv. Refrain from calling on the Board for decisions concerning matters that are being deliberated through the college-wide standing committee structure.
  - v. Refrain from comment on any matter related to terms and condition of employment.

- B. The College of New Jersey is well served by having many diverse points of view expressed on issues affecting the institution. The faculty/librarian representatives will complement existing voices currently heard through the Faculty Senate, the AFT, and campus governance. To encourage a broad range of participation by the faculty/librarian staff over time:
  - i. Each faculty/librarian representative may serve a maximum of two terms.
  - ii. Different faculty/librarian representatives from a single academic department may not be elected to consecutive terms.
  - iii. Each faculty/librarian representative must be from separate schools of the College.
- C. Each faculty/librarian representative shall:
  - i. Be tenured;
  - ii. Serve staggered two-year terms; and
  - iii. Be elected without reference to committee assignment, in elections coordinated by the Vice President for Academic Affairs.

  - B. The College of New Jersey is well served by having many diverse points of view expressed on issues affecting the institution. Accordingly, the staff representatives will complement existing voices currently heard through the Staff Senate, a variety of union groups, and campus

governance. To encourage a broad range of participation by the staff over time, each staff representive may serve a maximum of two terms, and different staff representatives from a single office/department may not be elected to consecutive terms.

- C. Each staff representative shall:
  - i. Be a current, permanent non-faculty employee of the College.
  - ii. Be employed by the College for at least ten (10) months.
  - iii. Serve staggered two-year terms.
  - iv. Be elected without reference to committee assignment, in elections coordinated by the Vice President for Human Resources or their designee.
